What is phonics?

Phonics is a way of teaching children to read quickly and skilfully. They are taught how to:

recognise the sounds that each individual letter makes;
identify the sounds that different combinations of letters make - such as 'sh' or 'oo'; and

•blend these sounds together from left to right to make a word.

Children can then use this knowledge to 'decode' new words that they hear or see. This is the first important step in learning to read.

#### Why phonics?

Research shows that when phonics is taught in a structured way - starting with the easiest sounds and progressing through to the most complex - it is the most effective way of teaching young children to read. It is particularly helpful for children aged 5 to 7.

In school, we follow the Phonics Play programme, however, we use resources from Letters and Sounds and Jolly Phonics also.

Phoneme-smallest unit of sound in a word.

## Graphemes-letters that represent the sound.

Segmenting (say each sound) and blending (put the sounds together).

Digraph-2 letters making one sound.

Trigraph-three letters making one sound.

Split digraph-where the two letters are not adjacent a\_e



The aim of this phase is to teach at least 19 letters and their sounds, two syllable words and simple captions. They are taught in this order, one set per week.

•Set 1: s, a, t, p Set 2: i, n, m, d •Set 3: g, o, c, k • Set 4: ck, e, u, r Set 5: h, b, f, ff, I, II, ss


### PHASE 3

The purpose of this phase is to teach another 25 graphemes, most of them comprising two letters (e.g. oa), so the children can represent each of about 42 phonemes by a grapheme.


- •Set 6: j, v, w, x
- •Set 7: y, z, zz, qu

• Consonant digraphs: ch, sh, th, ng

•Vowel digraphs: ai, ee, igh, oa, oo, ar, or, ur, ow, oi, ear, air, ure, er Phase 2 Sound Mat



Phase 3 Sound Mat






- This phase consolidates all the children have learnt in the previous phases.
- OCVCC words (e.g. tent, bend) and CCVC words (e.g. chip, trap).
- Two-syllable words
- (e.g. Sunday, lunchbox, treetop, windmill).

## PHASE 5

Children will be taught new graphemes and alternative spellings for these graphemes. •Consonant and Vowel digraphs: wh, ph, ay, ou, ie, ea, oy, ir, ue/ue, aw, ew/ew, oe, au Split digraphs:

a\_e, e\_e, i\_e, o\_e, u\_e / u\_e

#### **Teaching Split Digraphs**

- 1. Ask the children to sound-talk and show fingers for the word tie while a child makes it using the grapheme cards.
- 2. Ask the children what needs to be added to tie to make time.
- 3. Hold the m against the word tie thus making tiem, sound-talk it and explain that although there are graphemes for each phoneme this is not the correct spelling of time, as words like this are written slightly differently.
- 4. Cut the ie grapheme card between the i and the e, explaining that in this word we need to separate the two letters in the grapheme and tuck the final sound in between.
- 5. Stick the four letters onto the whiteboard and draw a line joining the i and the e.
- 6. Repeat with pie and make into pine.
- 7. Display or write on the whiteboard the high-frequency words that use the split digraph (e.g. like, make, came, made).




